Training camp Unfortunately this will have to be postponed until next year. We have run out of spare weekends before the end of the year. At least this will give you more time to work on your build ups for these new dives

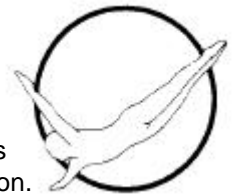

White Rose Invitational Novice Competition. 8-10 October, Leeds



Edinburgh Diving Club took a team of 18 divers to Leeds for the top novice club competition in GB. Edinburgh produced their best result ever – second in the team trophy. Two years ago we were 16th. Each competition had an average of 28 competitors. We had 12 divers in the top ten, 7 divers made finals (top 6) and 6 divers won medals. The winning team, Plymouth had 44 divers, which shows the quality of our team.

Jenny was third placed coach and Mary was second equal. Shame, if we had thought about it, we could have juggled it to win the magnum of champagne. What a nice train journey home that would have been!

Thank you to the chaperones, Sheila Carol and Susan for all their work over the weekend – the coach's job was made very easy because of them. 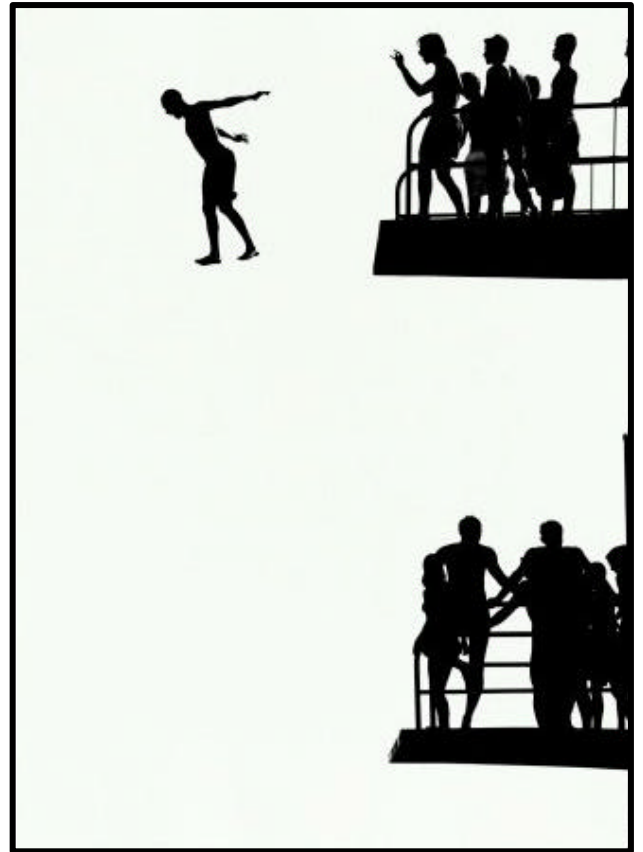
Southampton Invitational. 23-25 October, Southampton
